Dear Volunteers,

It is time to begin recertifying for fiscal year ending **June 30, 2016.** National CASA and the Statewide Guardian ad litem office guidelines require that volunteers complete 12 hours of Continuing Education Units each fiscal year. This year, the 2<sup>nd</sup> Circuit is doing it a little differently.

All Guardians are encouraged to complete the following training topics as part of his or her 12 hours of Continuing Education Units. If you have already taken one, some, or all of the following continuing education training, you do not need to repeat the training and are free to train in any child advocacy topic of your choice to complete the required 12 hours of Continuing Education Units.

Educational Advocacy	3 hours of classroom training
Psychotropic Medication	2 hours of classroom training <b>or</b> articles
Domestic Minor Sex Trafficking	2 hours of classroom training <b>or</b> articles
Florida's Early Childhood Court	1 hour of classroom training <b>or</b> articles
TOTAL	8 hours

The remaining 4 hours of Continuing Education Units can be taken in any child advocacy topic of your choice to complete the required 12 hours of Continuing Education Units.

A signed copy of the *Code of Conduct* is also required each fiscal year, copy attached.

Once you have completed the 12 hours of Continuing Education Units, please document the training on the *Guardian ad Litem Continuing Education* form. This may be done by one of the following ways:
